



Historic Pittsford Architectural Consultation Service

What is this service?

For almost 30 years, Historic Pittsford has sponsored an award-winning program that provides free architectural consultation to homeowners. This unique program, in partnership with Bero Architecture, makes expert advice available to assist homeowners in maintaining the architectural and historic integrity of their properties. Consultation can address exterior architectural changes and projects that require approval by town or village review boards. It is recommended that these projects are addressed in the early stages. Basic structural problems such as water damage, roof leaks, and chimney and gutter issues can also be addressed. The service includes an on-site consultation and follow up written report provided by Mr. John Bero, noted local preservation architect.

The consultation does not obligate homeowners for any future services.

Who is eligible?

Historic Pittsford offers this service to owners of:

- any property in the Village of Pittsford regardless of age.
- properties in the Town of Pittsford designated as landmarks or inventoried and eligible for designation as landmarks
- any property in the Town of Pittsford built prior to 1902
